PSEUDO-UTU — D. Harlan Wilson — **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Absurdism, technology, language, identity and urbanism are some of *Pseudo-City*'s general themes. In what ways does Wilson represent and explore these themes?
- 2. Describe Wilson's style of narration. How does this style reflect the content of the book?
- 3. In the first story, "Pseudofolliculitis City," the narrator refers to the setting of the book as a "schizopolis." Explain what this means.
- 4. Does the book conform in any way to traditional methods of storytelling or is it entirely untraditional. What is the effect?
- 5. How does *Pseudo-City* function as a piece of social and cultural criticism?
- 6. A number of characters appear in multiple stories. Are they the same characters in each story they appear in, or are they different? How do we account for these differences?
- 7. Does *Pseudo-City* have an overarching plot? Do its individual stories have plots? If not, why not?
- 8. The book contains elements of science fiction, fantasy, horror, comedy, action/adventure, comedy, noir, and irrealism. Is this multigeneric hodge-podge purposeful?
